These instructions apply to the Role Playing Exercises (RPE's) only: Position Papers and Joint Communiqués.

Your body goes here. Some guidelines:

- Your heading must include all of the information as shown above substituting your group's actual information. Underline the name of your group's contact person in case a question arises.
- When submitting your Joint Communiqué, list all members of Team A and Team B indicating one contact person by underlining in case there is a problem. However, leave out "Team A" or "Team B" in the title.
- You are not required to use L^AT_EX; however, if you choose to use another type of software, your document must conform to this outline.
- Below this itemized list is sample text so that you may see how the margins are set.
- The very wide margins are deliberate to provide room for writing comments. Please do not alter the width of the margins.
- When submitting your hard copy, print only on one side of the page stapling your document in the upper left-hand corner. Please do not file your hard-copy in a duo-tang, or similar covering.
- Using headings to organize your Position Paper or Joint Communiqué is probably a good idea, but the actual structure of your outline, if any, is left to the discretion of the group.

- The body of the text should not exceed 12 points and should not be less than 10 points.
- As with good scholarship, you must reference your work. If you reference a paper, please cite the work in your “References” section with cross-reference numbers. The format for referencing shown in this template is the default for L^AT_EX. You may use whatever format you prefer.

Some sample text:

We the people of the United States, in order to form a more perfect union, establish justice, insure domestic tranquility, provide for the common defense, promote the general welfare, and secure the blessings of liberty to ourselves and our posterity, do ordain and establish this Constitution for the United States of America.

Article I

Section 1. All legislative powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of members chosen every second year by the people of the several states, and the electors in each state shall have the qualifications requisite for electors of the most numerous branch of the state legislature.

No person shall be a Representative who shall not have attained to the age of twenty five years, and been seven years a citizen of the United States, and who shall not, when elected, be an inhabitant of that state in which he shall be chosen.
