#### **Promotion Rules**

Software Engineering is a cohort-based program:

- The class advances together through the program
- Everyone takes core courses together

Don't ever drop a core course

Everyone takes 5 (or more) courses a term

Don't ever drop a nonextra course

The Examinations and Promotions (E&P) committee determines students' academic standings and decides on students' appeals and petitions.

## 1A Promotion Rules (Special)

A 1A student proceeds to 1B as long as he/she

- Fails no more than two courses
- Has a term average of 50%

There are three possible academic decisions

- 1. Promoted term average of at least 60% and no failures
- Proceed to 1B term average of at least 50% and no more than two failed courses (must eventually clear 1A failures)
- Required to withdraw after 1A Engineering term average of less than 50%, or more than two failed courses

# **1A Promotion Rules (Special)**

 Required to withdraw after 1A Engineering - term average of less than 50%, or more than two failed courses

Such a student can request to participate in a Qualifying Program for Readmission (QPR) and, upon successful completion, may be readmitted into their program in 1B in the following year.

# **Promotion Rules (General)**

Outside of your 1A term, there are five possible academic decisions:

- 1. Promoted term average of at least 60% and no failures
- 2. Conditionally Promoted term average of at least 60% but have accumulated 1 or 2 failures (including workterm reports) that need to be cleared allowed to proceed to next term.

## **Promotion Rules (General)**

A failure may be cleared via

- Taking a supplemental exam (with permission from the E&P committee)
- Retaking the failed course or an equivalent course
- Taking an approved replacement course

Either way, the original grade remains on the transcript, and is augmented with a "CR" or "RPL" when the failure is cleared.

Other academic decisions

- Required to Repeat the Term Student has a term average of 50%-60% OR has a term average of 60% and three or more failures that term.
- May Not Proceed Student has accumulated three or more uncleared failures
- Required to Withdraw from Engineering Student has a term average of less than 50%,
